## *Historical Sketch*

Henry Bell was born November 11, 1893, in Salisbury, Missouri. He worked as a chauffeur at the time of his enlistment in the United States Army. Bell served as a corporal in the 317<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Company D in the 92<sup>nd</sup> Division of the United States Army. Bell died December 18, 1930, in Salisbury, Missouri.

## *Scope and Content Note*

This collection consists of three documents: a “Notice of Call and To Appear for Physical Examination” dated 08/08/1917; a “Honorable Discharge from the United States Army” dated 03/26/1919; and a “Token of Appreciation” certificate for military service given to Henry Bell from Chariton County, Missouri, dated 10/06/1919.
