Biographical Sketch

Walter Green was a captain in Company I in the 368th Regiment of the 92nd Infantry Division of the United States Army. Green died September 29, 1918, during the Meuse-Argonne Offensive at Argonne Forest, France.

Scope and Content Note

This collection primarily consists of documents concerning the military service of Captain Walter Green. The collection includes correspondence received by Walter and Thelma Green, covering the period 1914-1958; military correspondence and memorandums received by Walter Green while stationed at Camp Meade, Maryland, covering the period 1917-1918; and military service certificates received by Walter and Thelma Green. Other items in the collection include insurance and financial documents and business and appointment cards associated with Thelma Green; two unidentified and undated photographs; and published items, including one newspaper clipping and two booklets concerning crepe paper crafts. Oversize materials have been withdrawn to Oversize Box 1.
