Historical Sketch

Joseph H. Taylor and his wife Vivian (née Love) owned and operated a number of businesses in Kansas City, Missouri, including Skirts Billiard and Barber Shop, Vivian's Restaurant, and the Paseo Plaza Hotel.

Joseph Taylor was born in Topeka, Kansas, and moved to Kansas City, Kansas, in 1919. After serving in the United States Air Force during World War II, Taylor opened Skirts Billiard and Barber Shop at 1505 E. 12th Street in Kansas City, Missouri. Vivian's Restaurant opened in 1952 at 1205-07 Paseo Boulevard in Kansas City, Missouri. Taylor retired in 1983. He was a founding member of the Heart of America Golf Club. Joseph Taylor died in 1992; his wife Vivian died in 2007.

Scope and Content Note

This collection primarily consists of undated photographs of businesses owned by Joseph and Vivian Taylor in Kansas City, Missouri, including Skirts Billiard and Barber Shop at 1505 E. 12th Street; the Paseo Plaza Hotel at 1203 Paseo Boulevard; and Vivian's

Restaurant at 1205-07 Paseo Boulevard. One of the photographs is dated 1955, but this is likely the year of development and not necessarily the year the photograph was taken. The collection includes an undated photograph of Vivian Taylor at an Urban League Guild Tea. The collection also includes two newspaper clippings concerning Joseph Taylor's participation in the Heart of America Golf Club.
