Biographical Sketch:

Walter Ray is a Kansas City native and world traveler. Walter attended Seven Oaks Elementary School, Martin Luther King Junior High School, and Central High School in Kansas City. He also attended Penn Valley Community College, the University of Missouri Kansas City, and earned his Associates degree from Kansas City Kansas Community College in 2001. He is also a published author and poet. His travels include Mexico, the Philippines, Vietnam, Ethiopia, Rwanda, Colombi, Canada, Thailand, and West Africa, particularly Ghana. He began researching his family history and genealogy in 1987.

Scope and Content Note:

This collection contains scans of genealogical research by Walter Ray, photographs, and four books written by Walter Ray. This collection also includes scans of funeral programs, scans of certificates/ awards, a scan of a death certificate, a scan of an affidavit, and a college graduation commencement program.
