Biographical Sketch:

North Carolina Central University, as the university is called now, was originally founded in 1910 by a wealthy Black man. In 1915 it was sold and became a National Training School; 8 years later, it was reorganized to be a school for liberal arts education as well as for educator training. Later, it would be renamed to North Carolina College at Durham, and later North Carolina Central University, the name it brands today.
