Biographical Sketch:

The University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff, as the university is named today, was originally founded in 1873 by Arkansas state legislators as a Branch School to educate Black people to become teachers at Black schools. The school would later be renamed to Arkansas Agricultural, Mechanical and Normal College (or Arkansas AM&N) in 1927. The college is still active today as a part of the University of Arkansas system, becoming the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff.
